### + ARTICLE 1 - Arizona Road Race Series Description

#### + ARTICLE 3 - Participants and Racing Divisions

- The 2018 AZ Road Race Series is open to any man and woman age 9 and above. Per USA Cycling ruling, racing age is decided by the participant's age on 12/31/2018. Participants are assigned a racing category per USA Cycling and must enter races only accepting their category. Reminder: expert athletes are Cat 1 or 2, intermediate level athletes are Cat. 3 or 4, and beginner athletes are Cat. 5 for both Men and Women. Note that some divisions (Juniors / Masters) are age groups, not USAC racing categories. Thus, a Junior or Master participant will also have a USAC category (1, 2, 3, 4, 5 based on his/her road racing experience).

\* Order indicates the order of priority for scoring of divisions in the AZ Road Race Series in case participants enter several races during one Event. For example, if on a single day a woman racer enters criterium races in divisions Women Masters 50+ (order #5), Men Masters 70+ (order #18), and Women Cat. 3/4 (order #13), in the Series she will be ranked only in the division with the lowest order (in this example Women Masters 50+), and she will only receive awards for the given division (see Article 6 below). In short, participants are only scored in one division in the Series (e.g. like a State ranking), although they score points for each race entered (see Article 5 below).

By default, all Junior and Master divisions include all USAC categories (1, 2, 3, 4, 5), even if Event organizers restrict to specific categories (e.g. Juniors or Masters Cat. 1/2/3 or 4/5).

For Junior divisions, if organizers combine different ages (e.g. 9-14 and 15-18), we will split the corresponding Event results to fit the age groups listed in the table above for the purpose of Series scoring (and only for the Series scoring, not for any other purpose).

#### + ARTICLE 4 - Event Registration, Entry Fees, and Packet Pick Up

Event organizers are free to fix Event entry fees as they wish. Because we will collect \$1 per participant to partly fund the Awards purse, it is possible that organizers increase their entry fees by \$1-2 compared to previous years.

Registration for all Events will be managed online on <a href="SWSportsReg.com">SWSportsReg.com</a>, including late and day-of registrations.

Each Event will indicate the location and procedure for packet pick up.

It is the participant's responsibility to familiarize themselves with the rules of the Event and the race course they will use before the start of an Event, as well as to select a proper and safe equipment to use.

#### + ARTICLE 5 – AZ Road Race Series Scoring

After successful testing with other Series in the past years, we are introducing a novel scoring methods for the 2018 AZ Road Race Series. This new system works as follows:

- 1. participants MUST enter at least 50% of the events listed in Article 2 above to be scored in the Series;
- 2. participants are scored only in one division. This scoring division is the one with the smallest order # in the divisions table in Article 3 above. For each division, participants with the highest sum of points at the end of the Series will win his/her Series division;
- 3. each Event in the Series is assigned a pre-determined number of points (referred to as "ponderation" below) based on its discipline (criterium, road race, and State Championships status). For criterium Events, second and third races will also receive points, though at a lower ponderation than the first race entered. When a participant enters several races on a single day, the order of first, second, and third races will be based on his/her ranking in each race (not the order of races during the day), however his/her Series scoring will be based on the Division order # as explained in section 2 above, independently from his/her race results in each Division;

- 4. for a given race, the points scored by a given participant will consist in the ponderation of the race minus the participant rank. Eventual bonuses (e.g. points primes) and penalties (recommended by referees after disciplinary decisions) will be added and subtracted to the tally, respectively. DNS (did not start) will score zero points. DNF (did not finish) will score 10 points;
- 5. Series points are calculated by summing all points scored in all races during each Event (plus bonuses and minus penalties) multiplied by the total number of races entered (not Events), and divided by 100. This adjustment is to normalize points based on the number of races entered.
- 6. disciplinary sanctions taken by USA Cycling will result in penalties in the AZ Road Race Series, up to removal of Series scoring in case of suspension by USAC.

#### + ARTICLE 6 - Awards for the 2018 AZ Road Race Series

- Only participants attending 50% of Events or more will be scored in the Series;
- Participants who are scored as "DNS" will receive zero points;
- Participants who are scored as "DNF" will receive 10 points counting towards the AZ Road Race Series scoring;
- Points scoring is detailed in Article 5 above;
- The participant with the most points in a given Division will win the 2018 AZ Road Race Series for this Division and receive the awards indicated below;
- In case of ties in a Division, the ranking in the last Event will be used to break the ties.
- Participants who upgrade or downgrade during the season will take only half of their points to their new Division (indicated as a 50% penalty in the scoring table at the time of upgrade);
- Series scoring updates will be posted as early as possible on www.GoldWheelCup.com
- All awards are given as Gold Wheel Cup Dollars, meaning the amount is deposited on athletes'
- SWSportsReg.com account and can be used at any time for future Event registration.
